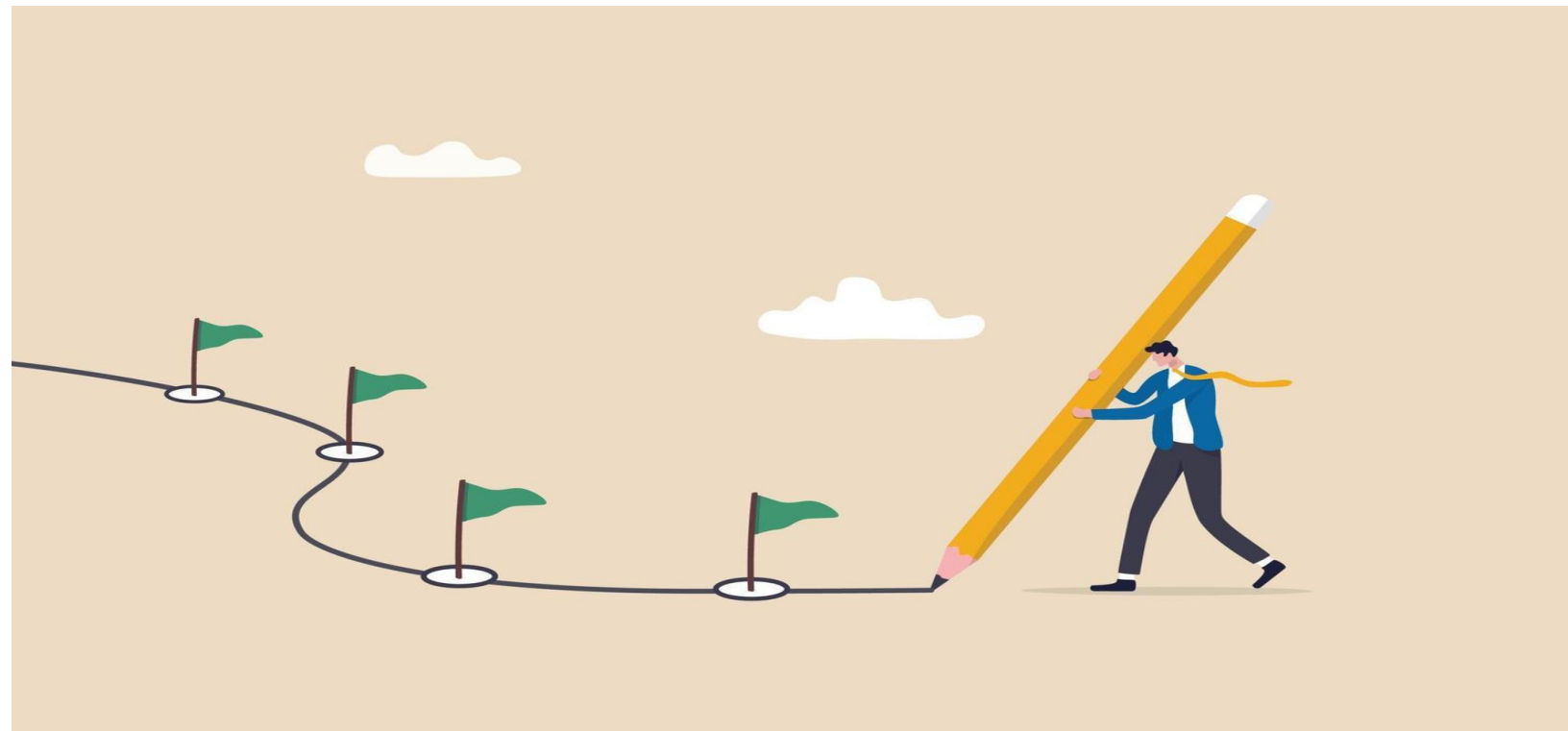

1. Project Overview and progress

The project, initiated in 2017 and continue till 2022, focuses on the sustainable development and employment of marginalized communities in 22 villages, specifically targeting the Baiga tribe, who are adversely affected by mining activities. The primary objectives include addressing health and education disparities, mitigating environmental impacts, strengthening community-based organizations (CBOs), and fostering collaboration with local institutions, with support from the government.

Project Objectives:

Health and Education:

- **Health Camps:** Regular health camps were organized to provide medical services to the tribal communities.
- **Health Awareness Programs:** Implemented awareness programs on preventive healthcare measures, emphasizing community health.

Annual Progress Report: CHILDLINE Toll-Free Helpline

Project Overview:

The CHILDLINE Toll-Free Helpline 1098, operational since 2015 and extending into 2022, remains a critical lifeline for children in need. Supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development (WCD), SYM operates support centers in the Korba and Bilaspur districts. The project's scope encompasses Pali and Korba Blocks in Korba, while in Bilaspur, the focus is on urban areas. This initiative is conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of WCD, Government of India, and Childline India Foundation.

Key Objectives:

Emergency Assistance:

Respond promptly to emergency calls to ensure the safety and well-being of children in distress. Coordinate with local authorities and law enforcement agencies for immediate and effective interventions.

Support Centers Operations:

Conduct outreach programs to raise awareness about the toll-free helpline, ensuring communities are informed of available services.

Provide counseling, support, and rehabilitation services to children in need, addressing both urban and rural areas.

Collaboration:

Foster collaboration with government agencies, particularly the Ministry of WCD, to strengthen child protection measures.

Participate actively in government-led initiatives aimed at improving child welfare and protection.

3. Project SFURTI (Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries)

Project Overview:

Project SFURTI, initiated in the year 2020 and continuing, focuses on the empowerment of tribal communities through the establishment of Community Facilitation Centers (CFCs) for Bamboo Craft Artisans. The project aims to support 903 tribal families in the Korba district, providing them with sustainable livelihoods. SFURTI is conducted under the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME), Government of India.

Key Objectives:

Livelihood Support:

Establish CFCs to facilitate bamboo craft activities and enhance the livelihoods of tribal families.
Create a sustainable model for traditional industries, promoting economic self-sufficiency.

Skill Development:

Provide training and skill development programs to enhance the craftsmanship of tribal artisans.
Foster innovation and creativity in bamboo craft to increase market competitiveness.

Community Engagement:

Involve tribal communities in the decision-making process and project implementation.
Strengthen community bonds and create a supportive network for artisans.

Achievements for the Year 2022:

Establishment of CFCs:

Successfully set up Community Facilitation Centers equipped with necessary infrastructure and tools. CFCs serve as hubs for skill development, production, and marketing of bamboo craft products.

Directly impacted 903 tribal families, providing them with a sustainable source of income. Increased production and market access for bamboo craft products, contributing to the economic upliftment of the community.

4. Mobile Medical Unit for Tribal Community Health



Introduction: In January 2022, the Mobile Medical Unit for Tribal Community Health project was initiated in the Kwardha district of Chhattisgarh, targeting 22 tribal villages with a population of approximately 25,000. This endeavor is made possible through the generous support of the SBI Foundation in Mumbai. The project focuses on delivering comprehensive healthcare services to remote tribal communities that often face barriers to accessing medical facilities.

Objectives:

1. To provide healthcare services to 22 tribal villages in Kwardha district.
2. To offer medical consultations, pharmacy services, and laboratory testing through a well-equipped Mobile Medical Unit.
3. To improve overall health outcomes and awareness among the tribal population.

Project Implementation: The Mobile Medical Unit operates with a dedicated team comprising a qualified doctor, pharmacist, and lab technician. This team travels to the 22 identified villages, delivering healthcare services directly to the doorstep of the tribal community. The unit is equipped with the necessary medical facilities to address a range of health issues.

Medical Services Provided:

1. **Medical Consultations:** Regular health check-ups and consultations are conducted by the on-board doctor to address various health concerns and provide necessary medical advice.
2. **Pharmacy Services:** A pharmacist is available to dispense essential medications, ensuring that the tribal population has access to crucial drugs without the need to travel long distances.
3. **Laboratory Testing:** The presence of a lab technician allows for on-the-spot diagnostic tests, facilitating quick and accurate assessments of health conditions.
